Teacher Professional Learning

The teachers spent the first 2 days of the year building on their knowledge and skills. Day 1 staff worked with Jill Flack on the role of the student in their own learning and how we as adults empower children to be self-motivated and independent learners. This will be the focus of our work in 2017. On Day 2 Sharon Hocter-Turner led the staff in our school wide reading and spelling practices.

School refurbishment and maintenance.

While we were on holidays a lot of work took place at the school. During the break the Prep -2 atrium refurbishment was completed. The classrooms are looking refreshed with new carpet, vinyl and paint. The operable doors between rooms are now able to be opened and closed. Teacher offices and one storeroom have been relocated and a library nook and sensory room have been created. Visibility in the building has also been increased with the removal of the static bag areas and the addition of new internal windows. The new learning space looks fantastic and will enable students and staff to effectively use all of the available spaces for learning activities. Both toilet blocks between rooms 1-10 have had new vinyl and toilet bowls installed. The lights in rooms 6-10 have also been upgraded to more energy efficient and bright globes. This work was the result of the \$120,000 State Government grant with an additional \$50,000 from school council funds. Please come in and have a look when you have the chance. We are very excited to start using this area of the school.

Work also took place in the grounds with the removal of a number of unsafe trees and the maintenance of other trees. We now have more mulch for our gardens and we will be calling on the parent body to support us in upcoming working bees to spread this mulch across our beautiful gardens. **Twilight Working Bee, Monday 20th February 2:30pm – 5pm. Saturday 18th March 9am – 12noon.** We really need family support to maintain our gardens so please clear your calendars and make yourself available to attend these sessions.

Asthma Management Plans

All students with asthma need to have a current asthma management plan at school, which need to be updated at the start of every school year. Forms and letters will be sent home shortly for those students who already have asthma management plans, and we would request any new parents to the school who have children with asthma to provide a plan from their doctor as soon as possible. Forms are available from the office.

From the Office

Absences

When students are absent for any reason (illness, family commitments, appointments etc) parents are required by the Education Department to provide the school with an explanation for the absence. This can be done by phone, in person, by email, or by sending a note to school. If explanations are not received the school will send a reminder note home to parents.

Visitor Sign In—Sign Out

All visitors to the school (including parents who are coming to volunteer in the classroom) are required to call in to the office to sign in on arrival and sign out when departing. Visitors are also required to wear a red visitor badge while on the school grounds.

Enrolment Information

We will soon be sending home a printout of enrolment details for all students. Parents are requested to check that all details are correct, and return the document to the school with any corrections highlighted. If there are no changes please return it with no changes written on the front. It is particularly important that we have correct contact details, phone numbers, addresses, emergency contacts etc. It is also very important that we have up-to-date medical information about students.

Canteen

Canteen is now open each Tuesday to Friday (no canteen on Mondays).

A new menu for term 2 was sent home with students yesterday.


